Dear Partners in the Ministry,

Greetings and blessings to you all from your missionaries to Cambodia, the Landingin Family. We hope and we pray that you are all doing well in this very difficult and trying times. God is always good and faithful in every situation we have in our lives.

Update from our family: As you all know, my wife, Rachel, gave birth to our second child baby boy, Gabriel, last April 11 and he just turned seven-month last November 11. Since last month, we are in and out from four different pediatricians just to find out why Gabriel is not improving from being sick. He doesn't have COVID-19, thank God, but after doing all the tests, the doctor said that our son is in Stage 2 of asthma in his very young age. We do not have health insurance for the whole family and for



Gabriel continues medication but we are praying that the Lord will continue to supply our financial needs for the upcoming Doctor's appointment and for his medicines.



Rachel, my wife, has celebrated her 31st birthday last November 8 and she continue to do the ministry that God has called her to do in the field of music. Rafael and I are doing well, little sickness and allergies here and there but praise the Lord for the continues protection to our family.

Update from Cambodia: For the past seven months the government of Cambodia cancelled all the religious gatherings because of the outbreak of the corona virus. The Church was not able to gather in one place every Sunday for the last seven months but we make ways to continue to gather our church people secretly in to small groups to continue to honor

God and to give Sunday for the Lord. Last September 12, the governor of Phnom Penh, the capital city of Cambodia, released a letter allowing all the religious groups to gather again following the health safety precautions. Since we received the news, we never wasted any opportunity to let the church people know that we can gather again in our worship place. We were able to have our regular Sunday Morning Worship, Friday Prayer Meeting, Soulwinning, Bible Study and Visitation. We are still limited because of the health protocols but we are rejoicing because God continue to answer our prayers.

Since my wife Rachel gave birth to our second child last April and lockdowns started last March, we are stranded here in the Philippines because of the corona virus. In the middle of the health crisis, Cambodia cancelled the flights coming from the Philippines because of the high numbers of cases. But this pandemic did not stop us to continue our calling from the Lord. We took advantage of the opportunity to minister to our own people. Rachel continue to teach music and I continue preaching online to our church people in Cambodia and to many churches here in the Philippines. As the churches here in the Philippines are getting ready to go back to their regular schedules, I was invited by many Pastors that I know for many years to preach and to share the ministry in Cambodia to their church people. It is a blessing and an encouragement that the Lord is using us to many people and to the churches we know here in the Philippines. We really miss Cambodia but it was really a humbling experience what the Lord is teaching us while we are stranded in our own country.







While preaching to different churches here in the Philippines, Pastors are asking me if I know some people or churches that can donate Bibles for their people. If you want to be a blessing in providing Bibles for these churches, I believe we can purchase the Bibles here in the Philippines and distribute it to the churches at the same time. As you all know, we are stranded in the Philippines, airports are now open here but flights going to Cambodia is still not available. We are praying and I believe very soon, we could be able to travel back to Cambodia. In preparation, we need to ask your help for the needs for our growing family. We are in need of \$320 for each member of the family for our one year visa and we are now four traveling back to Cambodia. In continues developing economy of Cambodia, many rules also change, they are now requiring us to get or to apply for working permit. Fifteen years old below does not need to apply for working permit, thank God our two boys are five years old and 7 months old. My wife and I are required to apply for working permit as soon as we arrive in Cambodia. Each working permit is cost \$200 from the agency that will help us to get our papers done.

So many needs to mention but we always believe that the hand of God is not short to supply our needs. *Matthew 7:7-8* says "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened."
